CURT HASKINS started his clay target shooting career in 1938 when he joined the Spokane Gun Club and has registered A.T.A. targets since 1945. He was President of the Spokane club in 1952 and 1953 and served on that organization's Board of Directors for 35 years until he resigned from the board in 1974. In 1947 when the club was moved from its Fort Wright location, Curt was instrumental in securing the present site and supervised all the construction of the ranges and buildings.

In 1948 Curt Haskins was appointed the Washington State Delegate to the amateur Trapshooting association and was a member of the Grand American Handicap Committee. He was Chairman of the Central Handicap Committee for nine years and A.T.A.'s Western Zone Vice-President for four years. Curt served as Vice-President of the national organization in 1960 and was appointed President of A.T.A. in 1963-1964. He also served as Chief of the Hi Yu Indians in 1960, in the year 1966 he received a 50,000 16-yard Target Pin from A.T.A., and registered several thousand more targets since that time. Curt has attended the Grand American Trapshoot twenty-three times.

For sincere dedication to all aspects of tournament trapshooting on all levels – local, state, zone and national – and for many years of work unselfishly devoted to the promotion and development of the sport, no name in the State of Washington is more worthy of being placed in the Washington State Trapshooters Hall of Fame than that of CURT HASKINS.
